Master-Planned Community Sets Dates for "Catch the Current" Ribbon-Cutting and Activities for the General Public

The schedule of activities includes plans for back country bike tours underneath ancient oak hammocks, pontoon boat rides or kayaking along the Bill Dance-designed fishing lagoons, swimming in the Rick <u>Wissmach-designed</u> WaterClub West pool, and personal tours to experience the breathtaking vistas of coastal marshes along Red Bird Creek. The events have been custom-crafted to introduce Savannah-area citizens to the unique lifestyle currently available for residents of WaterWays.
